Year 2 Trip to Roman Museum – Monday 7th October





Our awards this year represent our School Development priorities: ORBITS. The children have been busy designing our new stickers to accompany each of the areas of our School Plan. It was a very difficult choice, as their drawings were all brilliant, but we have settled on the final six below. Each class nominate one child to celebrate their achievements each week.



Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been developing our gross motor skills as we get ready to write. We make large movements to music while holding scarves or wands, then transfer the movement to paper. This week we have been making circular movements and each week we will introduce new movements as well as revisiting familiar ones. We are learning a poem as part of our Poetry Basket activity and have introduce the children to Helicopter Stories. Both these activities support their speech and language development and vocabulary as well as listening and attention skills. Mrs Memmott visited on Tuesday afternoon and led a music session with the children. We played musical games, responding to the music she played through our movements, such as stomping or tiptoeing. In our HeartSmart sessions we have thought about different emotions that we feel and how our faces may reflect each emotion – it has been great fun guessing what emotion we have been imitating through our expressions.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

We have had a brilliant week in Year R. The children are enjoying learning to read (this week, remembering the sounds g, o, c and k) and are continuing to practise blending sounds to read words such as d-o-g and p-o-t. Through our topic we talked about where we live and we learnt that some Jewish families are celebrating New Year this week. In *Heartsmart* the children talked about how we can tell how someone is feeling from their facial expressions and then we practised it with our friends. In RE, the children learnt about what Christians believe about where the world came from and they drew, painted and made parts of the creation story. Some of the highlights of our learning through play have been some amazing independent writing, restaurant and doctor role play and learning to use a stapler to make a book. The children really impressed us with how they got changed for PE. Some children even managed to undo their buttons by themselves and said they had been practising at home! Please make sure your child has a named PE kit in school at all times; our next PE lesson is on Tuesday. Thursday 10th October is the Reception 'drop in', 2:30pm in the hall.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

Another wonderful week in Year 1 comes to an end! In our English lessons, we started reading our new focus text 'Who's hiding at the Seaside?'. To help us explore the story during 'Imagination week', we created our own sea creatures and took them to the beach to hide them. We also played hide and seek in our playground, used different adjectives to describe the sea-creatures and different places at the seaside that we see in the story. Maybe you could visit the seaside at the weekend to see what things you can spot! We have been ordering numbers in Maths this week. We put numbers in order from smallest to largest and from largest to smallest. We also practised using the vocabulary: fewer and greater. We worked with numbers up to ten and ordered manipulatives like Numicon, cubes and tens frames. We have also practised writing our numbers correctly and both writing and reading numbers as words. We watched a funny video to help us identify these - maybe you could watch at home! Youtube: Scratch Garden spelling the numbers song. We played Dodgeball in our P.E lesson this week to continue exploring and developing different throwing and catching techniques. We had so much fun! Well done for a super week Oysters and Pearls! Have a great weekend!

Year 2 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

This term is going so fast! We have had another lovely and busy week in Year 2 this week. The children amazed us with their amazing writing this week! It was Production Week so they wrote up their final versions of their letters to their ninja enemies. We looked at the features of a letter and the finished products were fantastic! Next week we are moving on to a new text, A Cooked Up Fairy Tale, and have some exciting Imagination Week activities planned including blind taste testing, cooking up a Wolf Stew, and creating our own restaurant or café for a fairy tale character! In Maths we have finished our place value consolidation and will be moving on to addition and subtraction, focusing on fact families with numbers up to 20. In History this week we considered how Stone Age tools and houses improved in the Iron and Bronze Ages. We used this knowledge to create some tools such as axes, spears, knives and even bows and arrows! Next week we will be using our experiences and knowledge from our trip to the Roman museum on Monday to consider how the Romans changed Whitstable. In Science we have been learning all about mammals, birds, and amphibians specifically, their habitats and what they need to survive. The children used all of their knowledge to create detailed, illustrated information books which were fantastic! We are very excited about our school trip to Canterbury on Monday. We will be exploring the Roman Museum, the Roman wall, the turrets and the Roman mound, which is an old Roman cemetery. It should be a lovely day out for everyone!
