

Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we read the book, 'Guess how much I love you' and thought about how we can express how much we love our own Mummy. We have made our Mother's Day cards using paint, printing with our hands and then mark making with pens. On Thursday we visited the Whitstable Museum. The kind volunteers talked to us about some of our local and interesting history, sometimes going back millions of years ago! The children particularly enjoyed examining the fossils that have been found, such as a woolly mammoth tooth and a large dinosaur tooth. We saw an old fashioned fire engine – called a 'pump' which was pulled by horses and which we will be very interesting to compare to the modern fire engines we have today when we visit Whitstable Fire Station on Monday.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

We have had another fantastic week of exciting learning in Reception. It was wonderful to spend some time getting to know our new teacher, Mrs Slater. She will be back again next week! In *Drawing Club*, the children were really inspired by our beautiful new book, 'The Hike,' using the words 'expedition' 'stamina' and 'discover.' Perhaps your child can tell you what the words mean? In Maths the children were exploring the properties of different 3D shapes and in music we composed and performed different patterns and songs, using our voices and musical eggs. In RE, the children enjoyed tasting some hot cross buns to help them remember what some Christians do on Good Friday, and we talked about the importance of the cross. In worship this week, we talked about what some Christians do in Thursday of Holy Week and one child from each class had their feet washed by Mrs Spinks; this reminded us that like Jesus, good leaders look after us and we need to care for one another. On Monday we will be going to Church for collective worship and on Wednesday, the children will be going on their own 'hike' to Tankerton Slopes.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

We have had a super week in Year 1 and enjoyed lots of exciting learning. In English we designed and labelled our own pirate ships for 'Creation Week'. We also listed as many pirate nouns as we could think of, and wrote adjectives to describe as many of them as possible! These will help us with our writing next week in 'Production Week'. We are also very excited to dress as Pirates on Monday! Don't forget there is also an Easter Church Worship on Monday at 2:45: parents are welcome! We visited Whitstable Museum for our History, explored Cricket in our P.E Games, measured our beanstalks in cm for our Science/Maths and had lots of fun pouring and measuring amounts of water in Maths when learning about capacity and volume. It was wonderful to talk to so many parents during Parents Evening and we thank you for all your lovely comments! We have made some lovely cards for Sunday, make sure you check your child's bookbag to see our beautiful designs!

<u>Year 2</u> <u>Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cohen</u>

Year 2 have had another fun filled week! We enjoyed a trip to the beach on Monday and used our time there to use our senses and think of nouns, adjectives, verbs and adverbs. We then listened to the sounds we could hear and discussed onomatopoeia. We used this activity to write a repetitive poem about the beach. On Wednesday, we repeated this activity for the park and discussed the difference between our two poems based on the different settings. Some of us enjoyed performing our poems to the class on Friday too! In Maths we have been weighing the mass of objects. We used balance scales to compare the weight of objects before weighing them in grams. Next week we will be measuring volume and capacity and comparing the capacity of different containers. In Science we loved learning all about food chains and creating our own paper food chain for a chosen animal. We thought carefully about the plants and animals depending on the habitat. Next week we are looking forward to learning all about human and physical features in tropical and polar climates in Geography. We will be visiting the beach again on Monday to create a sculpture in art inspired by shell grottos. We will also be rounding up all of our football skills we have learnt this term by having a small match! Next week will consist of lots of Easter themed activities which we are very much looking forward to. Wishing you all a lovely weekend and Happy Mother's Day!
