
RAF Manston History Museum

Whitstable Library is running a craft event on Saturday 22 February, free of charge. The event will run for one hour and we will be making Pokémon characters








Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been combining subitising with counting actions when playing What's the time Mr Wolf? We have been playing some interactive maths games which have given the children an opportunity to demonstrate their subitising and counting skills, and some children are beginning to combine two small amounts when subitising. During our HeartSmart session we created a friendship web as we shared kind words and actions with each other. We have been talking to the children a lot this week about our school rules Ready, Respectful, Safe and how our hands can be used to keep ourselves safe and are definitely not for hurting others. We hope some of you can join us for our Stay and Play session on Friday afternoon next week. You are welcome to pop in with your Sunbeam child even if it isn't their normal session if you would like to. We will be having another stay and play session next term.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

In <i>Drawing Club</i> this week the children wrote about their adventures zooming to 'Button Moon' – they really
impressed us with their imaginative ideas and how they are using their different skills to write creatively. In
maths we have been learning to find and show one more and one less, using our stem sentence, 'one
more/less than is' Perhaps your child could show you one more/one less at home? In RE the
children have been thinking about our learning question: What do Christians believe is special about Jesus and
the message he brings? We have learnt that for Christians, Jesus wanted to be friends with everyone and that
Christians believe Jesus can bring peace. The children have explored different stories using drama, music, and
role play. The children have enjoyed planning and making different vehicles using junk modelling and we will
continue this next week. We continue to work on our routines and expectations to make sure that we are being
ready, respectful and safe, and we have been challenging ourselves to choose different activities and play with
different friends. On Monday we will be visiting church for collective worship and on Tuesday look forward to a
visit from the Whitstable Flute Group

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

What an amazing, full week of learning in Year 1! In English this week we have been looking at the -ed suffix and using it to turn verbs like 'walk' into past tense. You can help us with past tense at home by gently correcting us when we use the incorrect tense, like 'goed' instead of 'went'! We also learnt about Nouns this week! Nouns are people, places, animals and objects. Could you go on a Noun hunt in your home or out and about this weekend?! In Maths we have started to learn our doubles to 20. We need to learn these facts by heart, so it would be amazing if you could practise some double out loud with us on our way to and from school! E.g. Double 4 = ? We loved practising our jumping in Gymnastics and using hockey sticks to practise striking in our P.E Games slot. We talked about climate change in our Geography lesson this week and practised using different types of paintbrushes in our Art lesson. We learnt about Carnivores and Omnivores in Science, and sorted animals into what they eat. Next week we will learn about Omnivores! Well done everyone for your hard work this week!

<u>Year 2</u> Mrs O'Keeffe, Mrs Cohen and Mrs Cook

This has been another really lovely week in Year 2! In English we have started writing our information leaflets for evacuees coming to Whitstable. We have told them all about our fantastic school, what they can expect to see and do in Whitstable, and what to pack! We have used commas to separate lists, powerful adjectives and conjunctions in our writing. Next week in Production Week we will create our leaflets with illustrations and subheadings. In Maths we have been continuing learning about multiplication and division, with lots of practical activities to consolidate our learning. This week we learnt about division being the inverse operation to multiplication and used this to write fact families. Next week we will be learning our x2, x5 and x10 times tables, and related division facts. In Science this week we made lava lamps which was amazing! In Gymnastics we learnt different ways in which we can jump off and on apparatus. In Hockey we learnt about attacking and defending; next week we will put all the skills we have learnt this term into practise and play a game! In RE we continued to learn about Humanism and how it differs to Christianity. Next week both classes will have their marble jar treats on Friday – a lovely way to end the term! Have a great weekend.
