





# **Introducing Our New Whole School Awards!**



# **Weekly Year Group Recap**

# Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been seeking opportunities to develop our confidence and skill when using scissors. We have put smiley face stickers on our thumbs to remind us which way up we hold our scissors and snipping into things, such as playdough and spaghetti. Mrs Memmott led a lovely music session on Tuesday afternoon. We worked on developing our sense of rhythm using claves. We used our listening and noticing skills to imitate what Mrs Memmott was doing with her claves while playing musical games. We have begun to think about size and have explored some of the natural objects in our transient art area, thinking about how they compare in size and what vocabulary we use when explaining what we notice.

# Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

There has been so much fun and creative learning in reception this week! We continue to work on routines and expectations as we become more confident in the environment and in our friendships. In reading we have read our first Big Cat book together and have been delighted with the way the children are excited to be learning to read, using the phonics sounds that we are learning. In Maths we have been comparing the size and length of different objects in practical ways, including the length of string and the height of towers. We have really been enjoying our music lessons every Tuesday, with Mrs Memmott in the hall. This week we practised singing high and low pitches and used noodles to show the different pitch. Linking with our Maths learning, Mrs Memmott played music on the piano and we moved in different ways to represent our big, small and medium sized bear. Every day we have been developing our gross and fine motor skills through squiggle, when we practise specific patterns, firstly in the air, before transferring the same pattern to paper. This will help us with our letter formation and handwriting as we progress through the year. Some of the highlights in our learning through play have been making potions using natural resources, exploring water and engaging in water play, play dough creations and dancing in the rain! On Tuesday we be visiting St. Alphege Church as part of our RE learning to find out what Christians do to show that God is important to them.

# Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

Well done for a fabulous week Year 1! In our English lessons, continued with our focus text 'Who's hiding at the Seaside?'. This week was 'Creation week', we used widget symbols of the beach, seaside animals and items at the beach to help us write adjectives to describe them. Can you practice describing items verbally with adjectives to help reenforce our learning? We have been looking at number lines in Maths this week. We looked at ways number lines can help us. We made our own number lines on Monday that now live in our maths book and help us to form our numbers the correct way round and have supported us when looking at 1 more or 1 less questions. On Thursday we used our number lines for addition and subtraction by jumping forward and backwards. In computing we have been looking at keyboards the children have challenged themselves to write their name and even learnt where the backspace is so that they could edit any mistakes they may have made. In PSHE we spoke about who we are grateful for and why. The children identified friends in their class that do things that make them happy. There was lots of lovely Simcha on display this week! Well done for a super week Oysters and Pearls! Have a great weekend!

### Year 2

# Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

We have had another lovely and busy week in Year 2! On Monday we visited the Dane John mound, which was a Roman cemetery, and the Roman Museum in Canterbury. We got to dress up as Roman soldiers and explore lots of interesting Roman artefacts. It was a lovely day and the children really impressed us with their behaviour, engagement and enthusiasm! We learnt a lot about the Roman way of life too! In English it was Imagination Week, and we did lots of fun activities based on our new text 'A Cooked Up Fairy Tale'. We taste tested different foods such as ice cream and tomato soup, using lots of interesting adjectives to describe the taste, texture and smells. Using the wolf stew in the book for inspiration, we became chefs for the day and chopped, whisked, stirred and grated a variety of different foods! We finished the week by creating our very own restaurant based on a fairy tale character. Next week we will be starting to create a menu for our fairy tale restaurant. In Maths we moved onto addition, recapping number bonds to 20 and creating fact families from these. Next week we will be moving on to subtraction fact families. Both classes have filled their marble jars so on Wednesday we will have a well-deserved treat afternoon! Have a lovely weekend.
