

# <u>Sunbeams</u>

This week in Sunbeams we have welcomed some more new little Sunbeams in our setting. We have been so impressed by how quickly our new Sunbeams are adapting to and embracing our routines as well as demonstrating such eagerness to help with the various jobs our routines bring! We remain focused on settling in and building great relationships with your children and supporting them to make equally good connections with each other. We have been modelling and supporting Sunbeams with how to use the timers to help them manage their turn taking and already they are embracing and initiating their use when playing together and sharing resources. Just a quick reminder that although the sun has been shining, it is unseasonably cold at the moment, so please make sure your child brings a coat with them everyday.

## Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

Thank you for a fantastic first full week in reception! We are delighted with how the children are becoming familiar with their new routines, building their resilience, and getting to know their new grown-ups and other children. As well as ourselves, we also have the following members of staff who are working with your children: Mrs Cater, Mrs Huckstep, Mrs Mead, and Mrs Richards. This week we have introduced 'dough disco', which is one of the ways we develop our fine motor skills and strengthen our fingers. The children have learnt how to pour their own milk or water at snack time and we have discussed our school rules and expectations: being ready, respectful and safe. Next week, we will begin to teach phonics. We will send home your child's reading record with a sticker showing the sounds and tricky words that will be taught. Perhaps you could look for objects at home that start with some of our sounds, for example, 'sandwich – s' 'apple – a' 'table – t'. Please remember book bags every day and make sure that all clothing, coats and water bottles are clearly marked with your child's name.

## <u>Year 1</u>

### Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

Here we are at the end of a lovely busy week in Y1. Our imagination week in English has been so fun the week! We are looking at the story 'The Storm Whale'. We built dens to survive a storm, had a picnic in the classroom, explored Whale facts and constructed different forms of transport to help return the whale back to the ocean. In Geography, we thought about all the different sorts of house; terraces, semidetached, bungalows, blocks of flats and decided to recreate different buildings with large and small construction. In Maths, we will continue exploring numbers within 10 – counting on, counting back, number formation, finding different ways of making 10. This will help prepare the children for learning their number bonds to 10, and for later addition within 10. We were excited to have our lovely art workshop with Jo from Animate Arts! Jo introduced our art task to contribute towards our upcoming foyer installation. It will be especially beautiful this year, watch this space....! For this term's Science focus we are learning all about the body. The children went to the playground and with chalk made an outline of themselves and had the challenge of labelling all the different body parts. Wishing you all a lovely and peaceful weekend.

### <u>Year 2</u>

### Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

What a fantastic week of learning we have had in Year 2 this week! It was Imagination Week in English, so we introduced our new text 'Ninja Red Riding Hood' and the children did lots of fun activities including taking part in ninja training camp, designing their own gi and dressing up in a disguise like the wolf! Next week they will be creating their own ninja character comic strip and using all the powerful vocabulary we have generated in class to write a description of a ninja. In Maths we have been consolidating our place value knowledge with lots of practical activities and will continue this next week, using place value charts and part whole models. On Thursday Jo from Animate Arts visited our classes and in a fun workshop set us some amazing art challenges which we will be continuing next week. They are going to be out of this world! In History this week we have been investigating timelines, and plotting historical events from past to present. Next week we will be imagining what Whitstable was like during the Ice Age! Swimming lessons start next Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> September – we still need some parent helpers so if you are able to hep, please speak to Mrs O'Keefe or Mrs Cook. Have a wonderful weekend!
