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King Alphege is awarded to the class with the highest percentage attendance each week



It was a very difficult choice, as their drawings were all brilliant, but we have settled on the final six below. Each class nominate one child to celebrate their achievements each week.













Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we are learning about Boris the Robot who is made of junk from the scrapyard. Boris sometimes feels worthless because the Scrapman makes him feel like the junk he's made of, but Boris meets a family who love him and make him feel special. We talked about how we can all feel 'rubbish' at times, but then feel happy and loved at other times because of the special people in our lives. We then began making our own Boris from junk modelling. We have begun to develop our subitising skills this week. Subitising is being able to see what the quantity is without counting. We have played games to encourage the children to spot groups of one, two or three. During our welcome time, we use counters with 10 frames to help develop our subitising skills and number sense further. On Thursday we had a great deal of fun jumping in the puddles that the downpour of rain had left behind. Sunbeams thoroughly enjoyed splashing about – and yes, we did get extremely wet! Just a quick reminder to make sure you pack plenty of spare clothes and please return any that we lend your child.

<u>Year R</u> <u>Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones</u>

We have enjoyed another lovely week together in Reception. The children are enjoying learning their phonics sounds (this week i, n, m and d) and are learning to blend sounds to read words such as s-a-t and m-a-n. In Maths we have continued to practice subitising and have been learning to match and sort different objects according to different criteria. The children are enjoying thinking about our learning question for this term: What makes me special and unique? They practised colour mixing to paint a self-portrait. Thank you if you have been able to share a school book with your child this week. You will find a different wordless book in your child's book bag for the week ahead. We will be starting PE on Tuesday. Please make sure your child has a named PE kit in school at all times. We will practise changing into our PE kits independently. You might like to practise doing this at home over the weekend, encouraging your child to do this by themselves.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

What a wonderful week we have had in Year 1! This week, in our Maths lessons we learnt to use the greater than/less than symbols to compare numbers. We created our own alligators; who like to eat what's greater! We are bringing them home with us, maybe you could help us compare some different numbers and quantities over the weekend. We had our first production week in English! We wrote sentences about saving the Storm Whale from our story. We then enhanced these sentences by adding adjectives. We are learning about using adjectives to describe things. Can you help us by practising using adjectives to describe things in your home this term e.g. our cat is: fluffy, orange, soft, cute, furry etc. In Art we created some drawings in the style of Hundertwasser in our Art books. They look amazing! We also used our senses in Science to identify different smells, and used our senses of touch and sight to identify objects. What an amazing week! Enjoy your weekend!

Year 2 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cook

Wow, another busy week of learning and fun has flown by in Year 2! This week in English it was Production Week and we have been busy writing a letter to our opponent ninja to frighten them! We used lots of exciting vocabulary to tell them exactly how we are going to defeat them and that they had better watch out! In Maths we have been learning about number lines – placing numbers, estimating numbers and problem solving. We went out on to the playground and drew number lines in chalk with missing numbers for our partner to solve! We also learnt about the inequality symbols, comparing numbers up to 100. Next week we will be looking at counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s, which will help consolidate the children's times table knowledge. In History this week we learnt all about the Stone Age, and imagined what Whitstable would have been like during this time. The children enjoyed making Stone Age huts, listening to the story 'Stone Age Boy' and pretending to be hunter gatherers! Next week we will be continuing to think about how people would have lived in Whitstable at this time, with a focus on Stone Age tools! In Art we used pebbles and stones collected from the beach to create wonderful works of art – we pushed them around our paper using charcoal, pens and crayons which created a lovely effect. Next week we will be looking at improving our drawing skills. Have a lovely weekend!
