
Whole School Collective Worship at Church



Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have thoroughly enjoyed the sunshine and warmer weather! We have spent the majority of our time outside getting stuck into the mud kitchen, digging area, sandpit and some water play. On Tuesday PC Powell visited Sunbeams and talked to us about how the police serve our community. We learned about the different pieces of equipment he carries around with him and we explored his vehicle. We discovered that the siren can make 5 different and very loud noises to warn others of its approach. Mrs Memmott sang familiar songs with us on Tuesday. On Friday we talked about empathy as we watched a Bluey episode and reflected on the feelings of the characters in it. We then linked our empathy for others to Red Nose Day, where money is raised to help those who are less fortunate than many of us.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

What a lovely week of fun and learning we have had in Reception! In *Drawing Club*, we used the words 'nurture', 'miniscule', 'dormant' and 'flourishing' to help us with our speaking and writing, inspired by our text 'A tiny seed.' In Maths we learnt that 'double' means 'when we add the same number' – perhaps your child can tell you e.g. 'Double 2 is _____. (4) or 'Double 5 is _____' (10). In RE we are continuing to explore our learning question for this term, 'Why do Christians put a cross in an Easter garden?' and in music we learnt and practised using silence (a rest) in music as we sang and moved to different spring and easter songs. In *Heartsmart* we touched cotton wool and sandpaper to help us remember that sometimes we can use soft, fluffy words to be kind to our friends or hard, scratchy words. We practised using kind words such as 'I like your smile,' or 'You are great at ____.' Please make sure your child has their PE kit, reading record and reading book at school every day.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

We have had such a brilliant week in Year 1! It has been wonderful to welcome Spring and to spend more time outside this week! We have loved being outside for lots of our English 'Imagination Week' lessons, and for our games P.E. We have been pirates all week for our 'Imagination week': just like the story 'The Pirates Next Door'. We have dressed as pirates, searched the playground with maps for hidden treasure in a scavenger hunt and built pirate ships with the large, loose parts. We can't wait to be pirates again on our 'Pirate Day' in the final week of term. We also created our own pirate treasure maps and used teabags to stain them so that they look old and worn! We have been learning about mass in Maths this week, and exploring the vocabulary heavier and lighter. We started by thinking about the heaviest and lightest things we could think of, then spent the rest of the week comparing the weight of different items using the balancing scales. In Art, we loved using our string prints to practise printing on paper and fabric. We created a repeating pattern and our own class quilt which we will display for you all to see on the patio. We hope you enjoy the first weekend of Spring with some outside time!

Year 2 Mrs O'Keeffe and Mrs Cohen

We have had a wonderful week in Year 2 and have all been enjoying the lovely sunshine brightening up our classrooms and learning. The children been working incredibly hard in English, rewriting their own versions of 'The Magic Paintbrush' for their final Production writing folders. Next week, they will be exploring our local area to inspire poetry writing. In Geography they learnt about Innuit communities in Northern America and even learnt how to say hello and good bye in their language. Next week, they will continue to learn about indigenous communities living in tropical climates and how they have adapted to live there. The children have loved creating wire sculptures this week which have joined the sunshine in adding colour and brightness to our classrooms. Next week, we will join Mr Thomas-Friend and contribute to our whole school project focused on political art. Both classes loved exploring the nest this week, searching for plants and animals that live in micro habitats and next week they will be thinking about food chains, retrieving their Year 1 learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Could we kindly remind parents and careers to send their children into school with full PE kit for both Wednesday and Thursday PE lessons.
