


Whole School Sports Day Monday 1st July





Weekly Year Group Recap

Sunbeams From Mrs Humphreys

This week in Sunbeams we have been enjoying our play outdoors. We have been practicing our subitising and counting skills when playing games such as What's the time Mr Wolf? We have been developing our hand strength and dexterity, squeezing washing up bottles full of water to put out the fire (don't worry – we painted the flames). We've also been making potions using petals and flowers mixed with all sorts of 'interesting' things from our mud area! We often role -play an ice-cream parlour from the hut in our bike area, and this week there has been lots of mark making as they have written orders and prices down on clipboards and notepads. Indoors Sunbeams have been telling their own stories and acting them out during our Helicopter Story sessions. On Thursday afternoon we welcomed in several of our Sunbeams families in for a stay and play session, which was lovely.

<u>Year R</u> From Mrs Keeble and Mr Mead

What a great fun first week back Reception have had, we can't believe we are in our last term together! This week has been a little bit crazy! Some of our days have looked a little different to our usual routine but the children have been exceptional and have taken it in their stride. We started our final theme of 'being beside the seaside'. On Monday we read the story The Snail and the Whale and explored lots of creative techniques to do with our new focus artist 'Joan Miro' to make beautiful artwork. In Maths we have enjoyed revisiting number bonds to 10. The children have retained lots of fantastic facts about their number bonds and have decorated the classroom with number bond paper chains! We have explored lots of PE this week! We started our new skill of moving with a ball in Hockey. The children were amazing and had a great time playing lots of fun Hockey games. We also worked on our team building skills and created obstacle course to pretend the floor was lava! Well done for a great first week back Reception, we are incredibly proud of how amazing you have been this week!

Year 1 From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

What an exciting first week back for our last term this year! We have a new focus artist this term, and will be learning about Andy Goldsworthy, transient art, and sculpture. Andy Goldsworthy draws inspiration from his surroundings and natural materials, and for our first lesson we explored clay – how does it behave if you roll it, pinch it, squeeze it? What is the texture like? Can you create a shape? Later in the term, we will be exploring transient pieces and also creating a piece from clay. In English, we have started a new focus text, 'The Bog Baby' by Jeanne Willis and Gwen Millward. It tells the story of two small sisters, who find a mysterious little creature in a forest pond and decide to keep it as a pet. Who is this strange little creature, and what will happen next? As inspiration, we walked to The Nest and also to the wildlife pond at Whitstable Junior School to look at different habitats. In Science, we will be learning about animals, their habitats and their classifications, and linking this to History, where our focus is the life of Sir David Attenborough. We have begun to learn about Sir David's life, his love of all nature, and the amazing impact he has had at discovering different species, including having some named after him! In Maths, we are revisiting place value and the practical use of part-whole models, Tens and Ones boards and manipulatives like Dienes. Next week, we will be recording this knowledge in our maths books. The highlight of our week was a fantastic trip to the Chatham Memorial Synagogue in Rochester. We travelled by train and had a long brisk walk up the high street, where we were met by Kate, one of the educators at the Synagogue. We explored the beautiful interior, handled Jewish prayer books and scrolls, learned a little about similarities and differences between Christianity and Judaism and listened whilst Kate recited a few lines of the beautiful She'ma prayer, which is the first prayer recited in the morning and the last prayer recited in the evening. We were so grateful to all the parent volunteers that accompanied the trip, it makes such a difference to the children's experiences. Thank you and have a wonderful weekend.

Year 2

From Mrs O'Keeffe, Mrs Cook & Mr Humphreys

What a lovely first week back after half term it's been in Year 2! Our PAC children really enjoyed preparing for their performance, and came back with lots of stories to tell about their experiences. A huge well done to all of them! Our learning question for this term is 'How can I Get There?'. In English we used our new text, Oh! The Places You'll Go! By Dr Seuss as inspiration for lots of fun Imagination Week activities, including imagining our dream destination and planning a trip there! Next week we will be taking a walk around Whitstable (with a twist!) and the children will write a recount of this. In Maths we are continuing to learn how to tell the time, concentrating on 5 minute intervals. Next week we will move on to money and the children will be creating their own shops and cafes to help them understand finding totals and giving change, which will be lots of fun! In Science we are conducting an experiment into whether bubbles can burst, so we made bubble mixture and will be continuing with this next week! In Geography this term we will be looking at the features of maps so we will be walking around Whitstable and drawing our route on the map. Let's hope the lovely sunny weather continues! Have a wonderful weekend!
