From Mrs Humphreys

This week has been Art Week and Sunbeams have been getting creative around the theme of journey and fantastic landscapes. We created clouds using various materials, some were printed and others were made with a stained glass effect. Our topic this term is Pirates, so we have been very interested in maps, particularly treasure maps! We made our own maps and used the stories 'The Somethingosaur' and 'Green Light for the Little Red Train' to inspire the story maps we drew. All of these will be displayed at the art exhibition next Thursday at the end of the day, in the school hall. We have enjoyed small world play with a pirate theme, but also with the basket of wild animals such as lions, tigers and crocodiles. So much so, that crocodiles featured in some of our maps!

Year R

From Mrs Keeble and Mr Mead

We have had such a wonderful week enjoying all things arty! On Monday we found out that our Art week would be inspired from the story 'Oh, The Places You'll Go!'. We kicked things off by building our very own and unique hot air balloons, they looked amazing hanging in our classroom. We then spent time listening to our Reception Art leaders on how to make special bees ready for the art show next Thursday. They met with our Artist visitor and fed back to the whole class on how we had to paint our hands and use fine black pencils to create our bees. All the children thought of some wonderful designs and created some beautiful bees. Throughout the week the children had lots of fun looking at transport and animals that migrate, allowing us to produce lots of lovely work. We used lots of different types of media – paint, pastels, pens, collage, chalk – to decorate 5 strips of paper that our artist is going to transform into a massive hot air balloon for our Art show. In English we revisited rhyming words and tried to spot them in our focus text 'The Snail and The Whale'. The children produced fantastic creation pages for their English books with lots of rhyming pairs! In Maths we looked at measuring for height and length. The children used lots of different resources such as hands, feet, blocks, cubes and dominos to measure different items in the classrooms and on the big playground. Well done Reception for a wonderfully creative week!

Year 1

From Miss Hughes & Mrs O'Malley

The big news from Y1 this week has been our fabulous art week, based on the Dr Seuss text 'Oh! The Places You'll Go!' We discussed the stunning images in the text, created our own magical worlds, fantasy transport, winged creatures and then curated our pieces by mounting them and writing some information. We are really looking forward to the show and seeing everyone else's work – special extra thanks to our fantastic support staff Mrs Apps, Mrs Perry, Mrs O'Neill and Ms Weller who worked so hard at organising and managing the whole process, they were superstars! The second big excitement was in our VIPERS reading session, when Miss Hughes managed to catch three real live newts from our school pond in The Nest. We had decided to look at them under the visualiser and then discuss what we saw and ask questions. Pearl Class had the first go, but we got a big fright when we realised that one of the newts had escaped! Luckily, Ms Weller and Mrs Perry had a big search and found the cheeky runaway, hiding in the dinosaur box – phew....

We have been learning lots about animal classification in science this week, working out the characteristics of different animals and what families they belong to. In Maths, we revisited number lines and the skills needed to count on and count back, and used a Numicon challenge to apply this – could they build a Numicon tower, work out the value of the tiles, and then write out a number sentence, using their number line to find the total? The children loved this so much that we put it in our Rainbow challenges on Friday. Next week, we are excited to tell you that we have two fantastic events – our Creepy Claws workshop on Monday, and a walk to Duncan Downs on Wednesday afternoon, to look at animal habitats and try some pond dipping. If anyone would like to join us for the walk to Duncan Downs, please let Ms Hughes or Mrs O'Malley know.
