This week in Sunbeams we have been role playing aspects of the Christmas Story as we get to know it better in preparation for our Christmas performance. Many of our Sunbeams are already singing the songs we want to sing to you really well and we have learned a few more this week. It would be lovely if you can help them practise at home too. We have been practising our scissor skills by cutting out pictures of toys from a catalogue that we would like Father Christmas to bring us at Christmas. We then stuck these images onto a letter and signed it. We will be popping out to the post box next week to post our letters to Father Christmas and we look forward to hearing if our Sunbeams receive replies from him! Please make sure your Sunbeam brings spare clothes in with them each day, as we are running out of our own spares. If your child has come home in any borrowed clothes, please return them so that we have emergency spares when needed.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

This week we have been so impressed with the way reception children have been remembering and enjoying our nativity songs. In *Drawing Club*, our story focus was the animation 'Willo the Wisp' and our vocabulary words were 'fearless', 'dawdle' 'teeny weeny' and 'loop the loop.' Can your children show you the actions and tell you the meanings? They were so excited to bring the story to life by writing and showing numbers in different ways. In maths we have been representing the numbers 4 and 5 and matching them to the corresponding numeral. In *Heartsmart* this week, the children thought about their favourite things, and learnt that when we feel sad or worried we can think of our favourite things to help us feel calm. We have re-organised our patio for the colder months, and created more space for the children to develop their gross motor skills, encouraging them to move and stay warm! This week, they have loved building assault courses, riding bikes, creating a range of structures with the large equipment and playing football.

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

We have had a very excitable last week of November! Our Imagination week in English has included lots of exciting activities, such as; baking red cupcakes for Grandma's basket, acting out the story of Little Red Riding Hood in The Nest, learning about wolves, creating menu's for a shop and café and collaging food in baskets for the different characters in the book. In Maths we introduced subtraction and used number lines to count backwards. We wrote our number sentences beautifully in our books and our teachers were very impressed at how many of us are now forming our numbers correctly! In Science we acted as Scientists to complete an experiment: will it sink or will it float? We had great fun predicting which objects would sink/float and then seeing if we were right! In our R.E lesson we recapped the story of Christmas and created some beautiful paintings of the characters in the story. We will be learning about the 'pants rule' in our PSHE lesson next week, please find your teacher if you have any questions. Another week of fun and learning has flown by and we are another week closer to Christmas! This term truly is flying by. It was Imagination Week in English, and inspired by the beautifully illustrated text 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers we had great fun creating earth collages, glittery painted earths, popsicle planets, and starry night skies with chalk. We also acted out the life cycle of a human and created our very own planet! In Creation Week next week, we will be writing simple instructions on how to look after our precious planet. In Maths we tackled the tricky topic of exchanging when we subtract 2 numbers and cross 10. Next week we have one final week on addition, adding 2-digit numbers to 2-digit numbers using the column method. In Geography we learnt about water pollution, and created lovely posters about how we can save our seas. In Science we are continuing to learn about Materials, and will be considering the best materials that we can use when designing a shoe. Next week in Art we will be learning about the inspirational artist Jackson Pollock, and will be creating artwork in his style. On Monday we have an exciting Circus Day workshop to look forward to! Please ensure your child's PE kit is in school. The children have been given their parts and the Year 2 Nativity rehearsals are well and truly under way!
