

This week in Sunbeams we have been finding opportunities to develop our fine motor skills. We have taken inspiration from the story Oliver's Garden and used pincer movements with our fingers to arrange various pulses and buttons over line patterns. We have also been inspired by the season and wrapped wool around maple leaves. Mrs Memmott played musical parachute games with Sunbeams during our music session on Tuesday. Each week she has brought a different coloured ukulele with her and we have enjoyed speculating about what colour it will be for each visit. We loved welcoming in some of our families for our stay and play session on Thursday afternoon. It was so nice to see our Sunbeams sharing some of their favourite activities with them and thank you all for joining in with Dough Disco so well! We hope you have a well earned rest over the half term break and we look forward to seeing you back in Sunbeams on Tuesday 5th November.

Year R Mrs Keeble and Mrs Jones

Well done to all our children and families for a brilliant first half term at school. We have been reflecting on how much progress the children have made in their new environment, feeling confident with their grown-ups, and learning new routines, skills and knowledge. This week, we have been practising sounding out all the phonics sounds we have learnt so far, using our reading finger to sweep to read words. In maths the children have learnt to recognise and create repeating patterns, using two or more natural objects. In music, the children showed remarkable listening skills as they continued to develop their singing, awareness of pitch and movement with Mrs Memmott. Highlights of our learning through play have been making worry dolls with lolly sticks, exploring cornflour gloop and making and performing music together. In your child's reading record, you will find a username and password for Collins BIG CAT books. Please follow the link to read the books that your child has been reading in lessons. We encourage you to read these books as often as possible, until your child is reading all the words independently and confidently, without having to say each sound out loud. We hope you can enjoy some fun time with your lovely children at half term!

Year 1 Miss Hughes and Mr Mead

We have had a wonderful last week of Term in Year 1! We completed some fantastic independent writes about pictures we drew of all things Autumnal in our English lessons. We listed adjectives we were going to use to describe them and then thought of fantastic sentences to write. We did a fantastic job of remembering full stops, capital letters and finger spaces and made our teachers incredibly proud! This week in Maths we have finished our number and place value topic. We worked hard using our retrieval skills to practice all the areas of maths we have looked at this term. Such as part whole models, 1 more, 1 less, greater than, less than, number lines and writing words as numbers. Next term we will start looking at all of the different ways we can make ten. In PE we used all of the OAA skills we have been working on this term to work as a whole years group and create an obstacle course that we would have to balance on, climb over and crawl through! The children used amazing communication, teamwork and problem solving skills to work with their friends. We had a fabulous treat afternoon sharing our toys from home with our friends and going to the hall to have a big party. We had some lovely snacks too! A refresher poster of our learning this term is coming home for us to have a little look at over half term. Everyone has worked incredibly hard this term and we hope you all have a lovely week off with your families.

What a lovely week of learning we've had in Year 2! In English it was Production Week, so we wrote up our delicious fairy tale menus, using lots of persuasive language to persuade customers to come and try our delicacies! After half term we will be moving on to our new text The Blue Giant, and will be kicking off Imagination Week with an exciting sea-themed arts carousal!
